- How is "wisdom from above" (1:17) in contrast to the wisdom of our culture?
- How do verses 4:7-8 reveal the source of how we can be doers of the word? [Through submitting to God's ways and drawing near to God's strength.]
- What actions, practices, or habits would help us submit to God's ways and draw us nearer to God? [The means of grace are a great place to start worship, prayer, Scripture reading, journaling, fasting, and so on.]
