


COMBS for Mission Central and UMCOR

The Great Thanksgiving

The Lord be with you.

This Week's Resources for further study...

Key Scripture Acts 2:44

"All who believed were together and had all things in common."

Read again Acts 2:42-47 then consider the following:

What was necessary to have "glad and generous hearts" and the admiration of the people around them before "day by day" the Lord made it possible to effectively make disciples and grow the first Jesus gatherings that became known as his church?

<u>Devotion</u> was needed. Individuals chose to devote themselves to:

- the apostles' teaching, consistantly
- fellowship together, consistantly
- breaking of bread together (and recognizing Jesus), consistantly
- prayer, consistantly, and without ceasing

The people in that day didn't have the *same* distractions as we, but they had distractions. Like them, we must be intentional about devotion to consistant practices that keep us connected to God, our family, church family and community.

When we make the decision, as believers, to make our faith the center of our lives, things change because we change. God can work on us and through us when we are consistant in our connection to Him and each other. This is an important truth to embrace before the stay at home ban is lifted if we wish to see positive changes in our lives, families, church, and community which will inspire others.

Prayer of the Week:

Dear God, we stand at the gate and peer through, sometimes we just walk by and barely stop long enough to peek in. We keep creating our own ways, other "necessary priorities" of our choosing - adding to our stress and anxiety, yet believing that we know what is in our own best interest. We ignore the voice of the one Shepherd who will guide us to peace and hope. We wander aimlessly and then wonder why we get so lost. Help us stop and listen to the Shepherd's voice. Let us place our trust in the Shepherd who has never failed us, who loves and guides our lives. Forgive us our stubbornness and stupidity. For we ask this in Christ's Name. Amen.
